Reading from Matthew 27:45-50 **Removal of the Christ Candle**

A loud noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the time of his death and his resurrection. At the moment of the earthquake, the temple veil was torn apart, making the Holy of Holies exposed to public view. This represents God's change toward us with direct access to him, no longer requiring the ceremonial acts of the priests for our forgiveness of sin.
